

# Love Is\_ = Using your building

Everything we have comes from God, including our buildings, and so we want to use them for God's mission. A Methodist building that is welcoming, eye-catching and that acts as a focal point for a community can speak powerfully of God's love.

So the question is how can we use our buildings to show God's love?



## Ideas for your building

1. Could you open your building to become a cool space? With temperatures in our District hitting high 30's last year, could you open your building to offer a space that is cool and safe on a hot day.
2. Could the building become a reflective space for prayer?
3. Could the building welcome a community group to partake in Love Is\_ activity?

Note that it is important before you proceed with any idea that you consider the risk assessments needed and safeguarding implications.

# Love Is\_ = Prayer walking

Are you struggling to think of where to begin for Love Is\_? Could you start by prayer walking? Here's a step-by-step guide to getting started.

1

Be attentive throughout your prayer walk. Look up, look around, look down.

2

What do you see? What do you have? How do you feel?

3

Practise 'double listening' Listen to your surroundings, listen to the Spirit.

4

Any places you feel uplifted?  
Any places you feel troubled?

5

Pray a blessing on the people you pass and over the specific areas which have taken and at which you pause.

6

Stay in a group, but walk in pairs or threes.

7

Share insights with each other at the places where you pause and reflect those to God.

## Unable to go for a prayer walk?

If you're unable to physically walk, consider using Google Maps with the street view feature to virtually stroll through your context.



The Methodist Way of Life encourages us that “praying is a bit like breathing: like the air around you, every second of every day you are in God’s presence.”

It is also good to make a space in your day when you focus on praying. You can share what’s on your heart, pray for others, and listen to God.

# Love Is = Telling

'Tell' might feel like quite a brash and strong word. However, think about the last time something amazing happened to you. Maybe a new job, new grandchild or passing an exam. Its only natural that you wanted to tell others or those close to you this news.

The truth is, you've got a story to share about how God's love has affected you, a story that might make all the difference to another person.

Why not intentionally converse with a friend, whether in person or over the phone/online?

Thirty-six percent of practicing Christians say conversing with a Christian was a key influence in their coming to faith. Jesus shows us the healing, transformational



power of discussion in the Gospels. This is encouraging; you don't need special techniques – just a conversation that flows naturally from who you are and whom you're talking to. Here are some ways to integrate faith into conversations:

## Top tips

1

When somebody asks, "How was your weekend?", why not tell them what happened at church on Sunday?

2

Ask a question such as 'What do you think Love Is?'

3

Why not take a moment to write down and pray for the person you wish to share the love of God with.

We long for God's justice in the world. Around the globe and in their own local communities, Methodists are working for justice through responding to needs and campaigning for change.

Challenging injustice is never easy – it is rare for a challenge to be welcome. This can be something you do as an individual, but it can be better to work together as a small group or a congregation.

The project invites those who may be curious about faith to join others, together with FEAST facilitators, using their common interests to build relationships and further conversations about how faith issues surface in the culture of today, and perhaps even how arts and culture speak into theology and into daily our Way of Life as the people called Methodists.



FEAST groups will look different from Sunday models of church in that their location will, but not always, be a new place of gathering.

Their focus, especially in the gathering stages, will be on a common interest or issue which acts as the starting point for faith exploration.

Could you change the way you travel e.g. walk or cycle instead of driving?

# Love Is = Margins

“Never forget that justice is what love looks like in public.” – Cornel West

The cost of living crisis has resulted in there being more foodbanks than McDonald’s in the UK currently. The pressure placed upon the margins of our society has increased significantly.

When speaking of the margins we will use the Methodist definition:

*People can be marginalised in many, often interconnected ways related, for example, to ethnicity, gender, sexuality, physical impairment or illness, mental ill health, and poverty. Marginalisation caused by **economic poverty** can have a devastating impact on the lives of individuals and communities. We will focus on people who are **economically impoverished** or **vulnerable to economic poverty** due to their circumstances.*



We learn more about our faith.

You can become like Jesus. You are not stuck where you are.

Jesus calls us to be disciples, which is like being an apprentice. We need to learn, grow, change, and be surprised by God.

For some people this might be formal theological education, but we also learn through our day-to-day lives and encounters with other people.

There are lots of things that can block learning. We might be over-nostalgic and sceptical of the unknown. Or get stuck in an ideology that limits curiosity. Or just get distracted.

But, by definition, disciples are learners, so stay open-minded!

One thing we learn about as we reflect and look to Jesus is the love He had for the margins. So what does it look like for you to learn more about the margins?

# Love Is = Summer



God gives unbounded love and grace to us, and worship is one way of responding and celebrating this. Consequently, we are transformed by the grace and power of God, receiving forgiveness and mercy.

Worshipping God with others also helps to knit us together into a faith community, with mission as “the natural, even inevitable, consequence”.

We also worship God through our everyday activities – at work, at home, and wherever we live our daily lives.

So why not make this summer one filled with worship in more ways than one?

Could you worship together as a Circuit? Maybe with an ecumenical friend down the road?

Or maybe you could worship in the park or do something completely different!
