In addition to the transactions detailed above, a bridging loan of £405,000 has been advanced to the East Mercia Circuit to enable the purchase of a replacement manse in advance of the sale of the existing property. It is anticipated that this will be repaid in the first few weeks of the 2024-25 year.

6. District Officer's comments and report.

Many circuits and churches continue to be unwilling to commit to new projects as we recover from the effects of the pandemic, but the number of applications received has increased this year. However, we have also experienced the abandonment of a few projects and unused funds have been returned to the DAF. We are encouraged by the number of start-up grants that have been awarded and hope that they will lead to larger projects in due course.

We intend to keep the uncommitted balance as low as possible and our policy of committing the costs of some lay employees for five years has resulted in a small over commitment of £25,814 compared with an under commitment of £53,502 at the start of the year.

Circuits with large Circuit Advance Fund balances (over £100,000) are encouraged to use their funds imaginatively and grant applications are normally only considered if a Circuit contribution is being made. The DME is in contact with Churches and Circuits to advise and support them and he will ensure that new proposals follow the Mission Policies of the District and Circuits and the priorities of the Methodist Church.

7. Monitoring and Evaluation

In addition to continuous and routine informal monitoring, if a personnel project has been awarded a grant for more than one year, the second and subsequent payments will not be made unless an Impact Monitoring and Evaluation report of the activities undertaken has been received and approved by the F & G Committee.

A Property Panel advises Churches at an early stage, particularly for larger property schemes and property schemes that were approved over 3 years ago are reviewed to ensure their continuing viability.

All recipients of a grant from the DAF are expected to provide a report at the end of the project.
