Priority 2 Evangelistic

Practices

- District Mission Team Leader to work with local churches and circuits to use missional start-up grants for new evangelistic activities
- Encouragement in a District-wide evangelistic storytelling initiative called 'Love is'
- Encourage and resource all circuits as they participate in invitation events like 3
 Generate, Bible Month, and particular Methodist campaigns e.g. Hush the noise
- Building confidence in evangelism through courses like everyone and evangelist in the local churches.
- Partner with the Evangelism and Growth Team on missional events of national interest,
 e.g. Greenbelt, Silverstone, and other relevant events.
- Encourage through prayer and grant funding the involvement of young people at 3 Generate 2024-25.
- Support for every circuit to make provision for intergenerational and peer-based children's and youth work;
- The District to develop an evangelism resource around engagement with New Housing Communities based on the learning from the Overstone Community Pioneer Chaplain

Priority 3- Justice Seeking

Practices

 Develop a District strategy to support church at the margins and use MAPJ fund to support

- Strengthen the twinning relationship with the Presbyterian Church of the Cameroon by exploring a memorandum of understanding.
- Creatively engage Circuits and Churches with the 'Praise and Protest' theme of the current President and Vice President of the Methodist Conference
- Following the Conference of 2024, commit to prayerful study and embed the justice priority of poverty.
- To embed the work of the District Environmental policy and work with Circuits and Churches to access Action For Hope funding for relevant projects
- Partner with JPIT, All We Can, and other Methodist-affiliated charities who work that challenge injustice both in the UK and globally.
- For District committees, explore how District events might be focused on those on the margins e.g. Synod
